Discussion Questions

These questions are meant to facilitate discussion and application steps for you.

1. The story of Roger highlights that love is an uncommon value in business.
 - How would your workplace culture change if “love and serve others” became a true core value?
 - Where have you seen tension between business results and loving people well?
2. The teaching emphasizes that loving God is demonstrated through obedience and alignment with His ways.
 - Can you identify a recent decision at work where you had to choose between what was profitable and what honored God?
 - What made that decision difficult, and what did you learn from it?
3. Whole-Life Integration (Heart, Soul, Mind, Strength)
Jesus calls us to love God with every part of who we are.
 - Which area is strongest for you right now (heart, soul, mind, or strength)?
 - Which area needs the most growth, and what would it look like to intentionally develop that in your work life?

Forum Challenge:

Live out one tangible expression of loving God in your work each day.

Choose one focus:

- Heart: Check your motives daily—ask, “Am I doing this to honor God or for myself?”
- Soul: Anchor your identity in Christ, not your role or results
- Mind: Apply one biblical truth or principle to a real work decision each day
- Strength: Demonstrate excellence, integrity, and generosity in your work

Next meeting, be prepared to share:

- What you practiced consistently
- One key decision or moment where your faith influenced your work
- What changed in your mindset, leadership, or impact



Going Deeper

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“Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.” — Mark 12:30

This command is comprehensive—every part of who you are is meant to be aligned with God. Your work is one of the clearest places this is revealed, because your motives (heart), identity (soul), decisions (mind), and effort (strength) are all on display daily.

If someone observed your work, schedule, and decisions, what would they conclude you love the most? Where might something (success, money, recognition, control) be competing with your love for God?

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
